
Gamma Chi Chapter Pi Kappa Alpha Reunion

Featured Alumnus

Millard "Bucky" Harp

Bucky Harp was born in and graduated high school from McAlester, OK. He was initiated into the Pi Kappa Alpha Fraternity in February 1974. While in the house he served as President, treasurer, house manager, and pledge trainer. He graduated from Oklahoma State University in 1977 with a Bachelors of University Studies with an emphasis in Accounting. He obtained his Certified Public Accountant (CPA) and Certified Information Systems Auditor (CISA) licenses.

Professionally, he worked for Ernst & Whiney (now Ernst & Young), an oil company. He worked in business for self with a CPA practice, and later the Oklahoma State University/A&M Board of Regents Internal Audit Department. He currently works as a Controller for DCT, Incorporated, a government services contractor in McAlester, OK.

Personally, Brother Harp is married to Lisa Loy Harp and they have four children together. His hobbies include shooting sports and fishing. He volunteers on the Board of the Local Rural water district and Chairman of McAlester High School Class of 1973 Reunion Committee.

Brother Harp is currently a charter member of the Gamma Chi Alumni Association, serves on the alumni advisory board, and worked all day at this past International Work Day laying sod, landscaping, and making structural repairs to the house.







Question and Answer with Bucky Harp:

1) What made you join PiKA? Was there a specific person that got you to sign?

Paul Choate, a Pike from McAlester rushed me and convinced me to sign. I knew nothing about fraternity life. I was sure I didn't want to be a robot that did whatever "they" wanted me to do. Paul told me "The most independent men are fraternity men. " He convinced me that I would be a better rounded person, learn leadership skills, and be a better student with the help and guidance of older fraternity brothers. He was certainly right on all accounts. The first time I stepped in the house, the members made me feel wanted and special. What I now recognize as "brotherhood" permeated the air in the Pike House.

2) What is your most memorable story from living in the Pike house?

There are so many important and memorable stories and a lot of funny ones. One of my favorite memories is singing in the living room after initiations. The love and brotherhood was palpable. Great times!

3) What was the biggest challenge you faced in college and how did PiKA help you overcome it? Learning to balance school, work, campus activities, social life, and fraternity activities and responsibilities. Great men like Arlen Omtvedt, Randy McGee, Bob Williams and Dick Beshear (and of course Lewie Sanderson) taught me a lot and provided encouragement.

4) What do you miss most about your college days?

In college I always had someone around to hang out with or goof off with. Now it takes a lot of planning to arrange a get together.

5) How did you acquire the name "Bucky"?

I was named Millard after our family physician of 30 plus years Dr. Millard Henry. Millard was a little stuffy for a boy and my dad nicknamed everyone. He called his brother Jim "Buck" and called me Bucky.

6) Is there any other story from the Pike house days or your experiences after college that you would like to share?

The first time I visited the House, David (Boo Boo) Oldham was lying on the roof of Mom's apartment painting under the eaves. Someone snuck up on him and blew him off the roof with an M80 firecracker. Paul Choate turned to me and said "Oh. Great! That's Bob Williams, whom I most wanted you to meet. I think you should room with him!" I thought "What have I gotten myself into." Of course, I did room with Bob who is one of my favorite people in the world and the Best Big Brother anyone could ask for.

The Gamma Chi Chapter of Pi Kappa Alpha had quite a successful semester. In the spring alone, Gamma Chi made a significant impact on the Greek community through our performances in athletics, recruitment, philanthropy, improvement projects, and many others. We were able to incorporate new events and ideas into our chapter while holding true to our most sacred rituals, beliefs, and traditions. With the Alumni Advisory Board's guidance and an unrelenting undergraduate effort, Gamma Chi has made significant advances within the Greek Community.

Our athletic presence did not go unnoticed at Oklahoma State University as Gamma Chi won championships in wheelchair basketball, co-rec handball, walleyball, wrestling, and golf. Additionally, Gamma Chi made it to the championships in football, soccer, co-rec soccer, and quickball while also placing second in the Scott Carter Memorial Basketball Tournament.



We also won many sorority philanthropy events which helped dramatically with our sorority relations and rewarded additional funds to our own philanthropy. Although the undergraduates are disappointed with our 4th place finish, we are very confident that intramurals will soon be a place of constant dominance.

Gamma Chi was amongst the leaders in recruitment as well. Through the 2011-2012 academic year, we initiated 43 new members into the Gamma Chi chapter increasing our chapter size by nearly 40%. Within the 43 new members, we were able to initiate the newly found president of Student Government (SGA). Gamma Chi also participated in Greek Discovery Day where over 2000 incoming freshmen were introduced to the Greek Community and toured the Chapter Houses. This year, Gamma Chi has recruitment teams set up in Tulsa, Oklahoma City, Stillwater, and Dallas to aid in our search for S.L.A.G.



One of the most significant additions of our chapter included both our performance in all Greek philanthropic events and the creation of our own philanthropy event known as PIKE Firehouse Fever. In this past spring semester, Gamma Chi paired with the Fire Protection Society and the Student Associations of Fire Investigators to raise money toward the Firefighters Quest for

Burn Survivors. This 3-day event included an educational mock dorm room burning, pizza eating contest, a benefit concert, and many other events. Despite inclement weather that caused the cancellation of the concert, Pi Kappa Alpha was still able to raise over \$3k for charity while contributing over \$4k in chapter funds to support this

philanthropy event. While many other philanthropy events are held each year and the Gamma Chi Chapter actively participated in all of them, we were able to donate an additional \$7k toward other philanthropic events. We look forward to making PIKE Firehouse Fever an annual event while increasing our philanthropic contributions each year.

The undergrads at Gamma Chi are still in need of additional board members on the Housing Corporation! House Corporations are 501c(7) not-for-profit corporations, formed with the purpose of planning for, and working towards providing competitive housing on campus for their respective chapters. The manner in which the Housing Corporation seeks to accomplish this is by buying, selling, receiving, exchanging, leasing, renting, granting, improving, developing, repairing, and at times maintaining a mortgage on the real and personal property of the Gamma Chi Chapter.

House corporations are governed by a board of alumni volunteers, elected by their peers. While some house corporation board members have a background in real estate, the most important qualification is having a passion for the chapter's housing. At OSU, the Gamma Chi Chapter house competes with some of the best fraternity housing structures in the nation, competition which becomes increasingly fiercer as the surrounding fraternities are currently engaged in capital campaigns to renovate or completely rebuild their living spaces. A strong Housing Corporation is critical to the longevity of Pi Kappa Alpha as it faces these challenges.
